... the Omni Theatre at the Minnesota Science Museum in St. Paul is showing a film about Van Gogh's life (it is excellent). . . one of the best museum's around is the Mill City Museum just down the street from the Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis (it is 9 stories high) and it is loved by all ages. An elevator with bleacher seats takes you up and down eight stories as scenarios at each level explains the history of milling along the Mississippi River. The top floor is an observation deck allowing one to take a gander at the river and buildings of the surrounding area.
